

Dear Friends in Christ,

On Christmas Eve, our Holy Father opened the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica inaugurating the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope. Indeed, Christ is our Hope and in Him we place our personal hopes for the year ahead. Yet amid this call to hope, many of our brothers and sisters on the margins are experiencing great fear and anxiety. I am thinking in particular of our immigrant communities.

Much has been said of what might happen to some of our neighbors beginning in the coming weeks and months. As people of hope, it is important that we do what is right and necessary to instill confidence in those who are afraid, letting them know that the Church is with them

As the Body of Christ, we serve those in need, respecting and promoting the inherent dignity of every person who arrives on our doorstep. At the same time, parishes, schools and entities of the Archdiocese of Chicago must adhere to federal, state and local laws and regulations.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is working with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Catholic Charities, state and local governments and other groups to coordinate our activities of support in Cook and Lake Counties. Please find a collection of resources on our website at https://www.archchicago.org/news-and-events/immigrant-assistance-resources.

As we are called to do, we will prioritize bringing Christ into this time of fear and uncertainty. By asking, "What is God telling us in this moment?" we help families see that God is with them, even in their fears. This approach—rooted in prayer, solidarity, and tangible action—demonstrates that the Catholic Church, through its unique resources and faith, offers a beacon of hope. Together, we bring love, accompaniment, and the reassurance that no one is alone.

Speaking this year to the ambassadors accredited to the Holy See, the Holy Father observed that migration governance needs to balance regulation with human rights and dignity. "We are quick to forget that we are dealing with people with faces and names." Pope Francis has also been clear that "the principle of safe and voluntary repatriation of those who are forced to flee must be strictly adhered to. No one should be repatriated to a country where they could face severe human rights violations or even death."

Let us continue to work together in this spirit, and be faith-filled instruments of mercy honoring the human dignity of all persons.

Drodzy Przyjaciele w Chrystusie,

W Wigilię Bożego Narodzenia, Ojciec Święty otworzył Święte Drzwi Bazyliki Świętego Piotra, czym zainaugurował Jubileuszowy Rok Nadziei 2025. Chrystus jest bowiem naszą Nadzieją, to w Nim pokładamy nasze osobiste nadzieje na nadchodzący rok. Jednak pośród tego wezwania do nadziei, wielu naszych braci i wiele sióstr żyjących na obrzeżach społecznych doświadcza wielkiego strachu i niepokoju. Myślę tu w szczególności o naszych wspólnotach imigrantów.

Wiele powiedziano o tym, co może spotkać niektórych naszych bliźnich w nadchodzących tygodniach i miesiącach. Ważne jest, abyśmy, jako ludzie nadziei, czynili to, co słuszne i konieczne, aby zaszczepić ufność tym, którzy się boją, jak również dać im do zrozumienia, że Kościół jest z nimi.

Jako Ciało Chrystusa, służymy potrzebującym, szanujemy i promujemy przyrodzoną godność każdego człowieka, który staje przed naszymi drzwiami. Jednocześnie parafie, szkoły i jednostki administracyjne Archidiecezji Chicago muszą przestrzegać przepisów i regulacji federalnych, stanowych i lokalnych.

Archidiecezja Chicago współpracuje z Konferencją Biskupów Katolickich Stanów Zjednoczonych, katolicką organizacją pomocową Caritas, prawodawcami stanowymi i lokalnymi oraz z innymi grupami w celu koordynowania naszych działań pomocowych w powiatach Cook i Lake. Zgodnie z naszym powołaniem, naszym priorytetem jest niesienie Chrystusa tam, gdzie panuje strach i niepewność. Zadając pytanie: "Co Bóg mówi nam w tym momencie?", pomagamy rodzinom zobaczyć, że Bóg jest z nimi, nawet w ich lękach. To podejście - zakorzenione w modlitwie, solidarności i konkretnych działaniach - pokazuje, że Kościół katolicki, dzięki swoim unikalnym zasobom i wierze, oferuje światło nadziei. Razem niesiemy miłość, towarzyszymy potrzebującym i zapewniamy ich, że nikt nie jest sam.

W tym roku, w swoim wystąpieniu do ambasadorów akredytowanych przy Stolicy Apostolskiej, Ojciec Święty zauważył, że zarządzanie migracją musi być zrównoważone zasadami poszanowania godności człowieka i jego praw. "Łatwo zapominamy, że mamy do czynienia z ludźmi, którzy mają konkretne twarze i noszą konkretne imiona". Papież Franciszek jasno stwierdził również, że: "musi być bezwzględnie przestrzegana zasada bezpiecznej i dobrowolnej repatriacji osób zmuszonych do ucieczki. Nikt nie powinien być przesiedlony do kraju, w którym mógłby zostać narażony na poważne naruszenia praw człowieka, a nawet na śmierć.

Kontynuujmy współpracę w tym duchu oraz bądźmy napełnionymi wiarą narzędziami miłosierdzia, które szanują godność ludzką każdej osoby.
